FCC Offers Broadband Assistance

Starting May 12th the FCC is offering a discount of up to a \$50/month discount on qualifying individuals broadband service and associated equipment rentals. This program is nationwide.

To qualify individuals must be at or under 135% of poverty. They can also qualify through participation in SNAP, Medicaid, Supplemental Security Income, Federal Public Housing Assistance, or Veterans and Survivors Pension Benefit. Other ways of qualification are available on the website at getemergencybroadband.org/do-i-qualify/.

Interested persons can call their broadband provider, or go to getemergencybroadband.org/how-to-apply/. They can also apply through the mail by printing an application in English or Spanish (instructions also available in 8 additional languages). When they complete the application they can send it and proof of eligibility to:


COVID-19 Vaccination Ticket Offer

COVID-19

Vaccines: Trust the Facts

- ▶ **1. All COVID-19 vaccines are safe and effective.** COVID-19 vaccines currently available in the U.S. were rigorously tested and proven effective at preventing serious illness, hospitalization, and death from COVID-19 disease.
- ▶ **2. You can't get COVID-19 from a COVID-19 vaccine.** The COVID-19 vaccines do not contain the live virus that causes COVID-19, meaning they can't give you COVID-19 or cause a positive COVID-19 viral test.
- ▶ **3. COVID-19 vaccine studies were among the largest in history.** A typical vaccine study has about 5,000 participants. The Moderna COVID-19 clinical trial had about 30,000 participants, and the Johnson & Johnson and Pfizer-BioNTech trials had about 43,000 each.
- ▶ **4. COVID-19 vaccines have not been linked to infertility or miscarriage.** There is no evidence that COVID-19 vaccines cause infertility or increase the risk of miscarriage.
- ▶ **5. No serious safety concerns were observed in clinical trials.** The most common side effects, much like other vaccines, are fatigue, headache, fever or chills, soreness, redness or swelling at the injection site, and muscle or joint pain.
- ▶ **6. COVID-19 vaccines will not change your DNA or alter your genetic makeup.** None of the COVID-19 vaccines alter or modify a person's genetic makeup. They all teach the body how to protect against future infection.
- ▶ **7. Vaccine injections do NOT contain microchips or tracking devices.** Vaccines do not contain microchips, nanochips, RFID trackers, or devices that would track or control your body in any way.
- ▶ **8. Vaccines do not cause autism.** Studies conducted across the globe continue to show that there is no connection between autism and vaccines.

Mass Vaccination Clinic Updates

Beginning Tuesday, May 18, the mass vaccination clinic at Cleveland State University's Wolstein Center will begin administering the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine to Ohio's youth, aged 12 and older. Appointments will be open from the May 18th until May 31st. Children under 18 must have a parent or legal guardian's consent to get the vaccine.

Vaccine eligible Ohioans can sign up to get the vaccine at the Wolstein Center by going to gettheshot.coronavirus.ohio.gov. Enter the ZIP code 44115 in the zip code search field. Appointments can also be scheduled over the phone by calling 1-833-427-5634.

For local vaccine locations call 2-1-1 or go to gettheshot.coronavirus.ohio.gov and put in your local zip code.

COVID-19 Health Orders to End

Gov. Mike DeWine has announced that the state of Ohio will remove its COVID-19 health orders effective on June 2, with the exception of those in nursing homes and assisted living facilities.

DeWine has also announced that Ohio will conform to the CDC's new guidelines for mask wearing. The CDC announced last week that fully vaccinated individuals do not need to wear masks or social distance, with some exceptions. People who are immunocompromised should speak to their doctors before discontinuing mask wearing and masks are still required on public transportation, trains, planes, and other forms of shared travel.

DeWine announced that the current orders will be amended to match CDC's new guidelines, and the amended guidelines will remain in place until June 2nd.

DeWine has also announces that Ohioans at least 18 years and older who have received at least one vaccine will be entered to win 1 million dollars. There will be five drawings, with the first drawing on the 26th of May.

COVID-19 Vaccine Expanded Eligibility

If you are having trouble signing up for the Covid-19 vaccine, call 2-1-1 for local vaccine information.

There is now a state website where you can find your local vaccine providers and even register with some of them, <http://gettheshot.coronavirus.ohio.gov/>.
