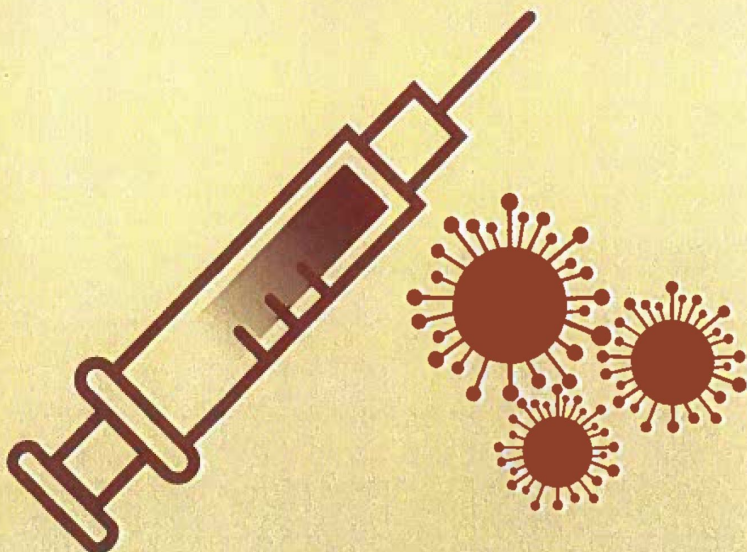

Our senior nutrition program provides hot, nutritious meals for local seniors. In addition to the meal, our staff also

conduct a wellness check with every delivery, Monday-Friday.

A minimum contribution of \$3.00 is requested for each meal delivered. No person will be denied service based on

inability to pay.

The home delivered meal program is available to seniors age 60 and older who struggle to prepare or obtain their own meals, and do not have anyone to provide the support for them.

Assistance may exist for those under 60 that are disabled. Call our office for details.

We also have senior dining sites where all seniors, ages 60 and older, are welcome to enjoy lunch. The meals are made fresh daily in our Jefferson kitchen and served hot in our dining rooms in Ashtabula, Jefferson, and Conneaut.
