
Welcome to our 2-1-1 newsletter,.. "The 4-1-1 on 2-1-1"!

Unmet needs calls are calls where our operator couldn't match a caller with a resource. This can happen for a variety of reasons. Sometimes needs are unmet because a program is out of funding or out of season. Other times the client may not qualify for a program, or there may not be a program to meet the caller's need. 2-1-1 Ashtabula County attempts to track these calls to see what 'unmet needs' there are in our community.

This year 2-1-1 Ashtabula County had 243 unmet needs calls.

Our top category of unmet needs in 2021 was 'Clothing, Personal, and Household needs' at 27% of our unmet needs calls. This category covers a great deal of ground and included things like needing furniture and household appliances. Two common unmet needs in this category were bed bug removal and people in need of a stove.

Our second highest category in 2021 was 'Housing' with 17% of our unmet needs calls. This category includes things like finding an apartment, getting repairs done, and paying rent or mortgage. While there were many programs that met these needs over the past year, funding was largely not available until Spring 2021 and some may not have qualified for those programs once available.

Our third highest unmet need category in 2021 was 'Transportation' with 12% of our unmet needs calls. This category includes trips to the doctors, car repairs, transportation outside of the county, and similar needs. Two common unmet needs in this category were car repairs and gas cards.

The mobile food pantry program provides a produce give away in multiple places in the county. For more information please call 2-1-1 for your local food pantry information.


