



Sue Legg, the Volunteer Service Manager for Hospice of the Western Reserve, is scheduled to address league members via Zoom on February 27th at 7:00 PM. Her talk, titled "Hospice, Dementia, and How You Can Help," will focus on the critical role of volunteers in Ashtabula County, particularly as patients enter the final stage of life.

Sue Legg serves as the Volunteer Service Manager at Hospice of the Western Reserve (HWR), a leading non-profit organization and one of northeast Ohio's largest hospice care providers. She oversees volunteer services in Ashtabula County, operating from their office on Lake Avenue, Ashtabula.

With an impressive tenure of 11 years at HWR, Legg plays a crucial role in the organization. Volunteers form the backbone of HWR, and her responsibilities include recruiting and training volunteers and coordinating their assignments to support patients and their families. This role allows her to make a significant impact on providing care with dignity and respect for those at the end of their lives.

Before joining HWR, Legg's career was rooted in radiation and medical oncology, where she worked as an office coordinator. Her experience during this period involved aiding individuals in living their lives to the fullest amidst medical treatments. Transitioning to her current role at HWR, she continues to contribute profoundly, now focusing on ensuring patients experience a dignified and respectful end-oflife journey.

Outside of her professional life, Legg is family-oriented, married with three children and blessed with six grandchildren. She cherishes the time she spends with family and friends, particularly enjoying outdoor activities like camping and fishing, which bring her immense joy and relaxation.
